Sir, I have been advised to apply to you in order to ascertain by whom the oil painting as per accompanying photograph may have been painted. I should therefore be exceedingly obliged to you, if you would kindly assist in the matter.

This small painting, 26 x 34 cm, done on an old piece of wood, appears to have been painted about the middle of the XIX. century. It has come, many years ago, from Antwerp. Colours: the picture has been painted in a light-brown key. The man reading at the table wears a red jacket. The man raising a glass of beer wears a blue cap. These colours (red & blue) correspond to those of the French tricolore. The other men wear black velvet caps - their clothes are partly of a dark grey, partly of brownish shades. The treatment in painting the eyes might indicate the author. The picture, I should say a sketch done at a sketching evening - time sketch - appears to have been done rapidly.

If necessary I could have the picture sent to you for inspection. I am told that it may be the work of a Belgian or Northern French artist about 1840 & it seems to be the work of a very good hand.
